





Guru Gobind Singh, the tenth Guru was born in 1666 at Patna. He was ordained as a Guru at the tender age of nine, after his father Guru Tegh Bahadur laid down his life in the court of Aurangzeb for the cause of Kashmiri Pandits.

Guru Gobind Singh was one of the greatest personalities of all times. In him were united the qualities of a spiritual leader and a warrior. He stood for human freedom, secularism, democratic principles and pleaded for man's inalienable rights. He was a perfect man for the needs of the time. He left for his heavenly abode at the age of 42 in 1708 AD at Nanded, Maharashtra. Prior to this, he gave Guruship to Sri Guru Granth Sahib. For the Sikhs, Guru Granth Sahib is looked upon as embodiment of the Guru. It is not merely a collection of hymns but also is the 'Divine Word'. The message of love, truth, contentment, humility fatherhood of God, brotherhood, of man restraint on passions, purity of mind and body and search for the self form the subject matter of The Granth Sahib.

The pioneering efforts of the Sikh officers of BSL under the able guidance of Late Shri G.S. Grewal are enshrined in the school history. The Society has its headquarter at GGPS, Sector-V/B, Bokaro Steel City. The other branches are at Chas, Dhanbad, Daltonganj, Mohali and Hoshiarpur. The Society also runs a Technical Campus (Engineering & M.B.A), named G.G.E.S.T.C Kandra, Chas, Bokaro.

VISION OF THE SCHOOL

GGPS is committed to Innovation which is given primary importance and is practiced by encouraging students to participate in various competitions.

All round development of personality is being given more importance by encouraging them to participate in sports, art, literary works, drawings, paintings, co-scholastic activities. To recognize and to bring forth the hidden potentialities of our students for an all round development of their personality is committed by fostering excellence in academics, sports and morality in an inspiring an encouraging environment, laying great emphasis on character building, leadership, integrity, service and respect.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

Attainment of academic excellence coupled with the development of social skills of a child.

SCHOOL PHILOSOPHY

The School believes in Guru Gobind Singhji's preachings which are based on oneness and equality of mankind. Discrimination on the basis of gender, race, social prejudices are altogether absent.

The School aims at providing equal opportunities to all to rediscover their hidden potentials & develop their personal values & thinking process which would facilitate flexibility in the thought along with analytical & scientific approach to life.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

1. Students should be disciplined in and out of the school premises.
2. Students should be truthful and endeavour to follow it in true letter & spirit.
3. It would be mandatory for every GGPSian to communicate in English only since it is medium of instruction.
4. Students should be regular and punctual in their attendance on school days.
5. Students should be polite & courteous in and outside the school campus.
6. Students should respect the school rules and regulations of their teachers, the liberty and rights of others,
7. Students are expected to nurture and pursue all good habits shedding off undesirable ones to create a healthy and safe surrounding.
8. Students should be diligent and never procrastinate the duties obligations assigned to them.
9. Students should be proud of their uniform & maintain it with due regard.
10. Cleanliness in all respects should be given utmost priority for healthy & hygienic environment in and around the school.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS /GUARDIANS

The School believes in discipline, obedience and promptness, Disregard of school rules, deteriorating performances and long absenteeism will lead to disciplinary action amounting even to the issuance of a transfer certificate.

1. Parents / Guardians are allowed to meet the respective Vice Principal / Incharge / Class teacher in the reception area / Office of Vice Principal in the stipulated time only with visitor's card. No parent will be entertained without visitor's card for safety reason.

2. The school is to be informed if there is any change in the address of the parents/guardian.
3. Once the child gets into the school, the child will not be allowed to go out except for extreme exigency.
4. No parents will be entertained in the school premises without escort card for safety reasons.
5. **No change in the details related to name and date of birth entered in the Admission Register of the school as supplied by the parents will be entertained under any circumstances.**
6. Children when sick specially suffering from infectious diseases should not be sent to school.
7. Attendance of Parent / Guardian is mandatory on Parent Teachers' Meet.
8. Parents /Guardians would have to pay a fine of Rs 50/- for issue of duplicate report card/escort card/identity card in case of loss of the original report card /escort card /identity card.
9. Name, admission number, class /section & house of the students should be clearly marked on his/her belongings such as bag, pullover, blazers etc.
10. Care must be taken of school property and any damage caused by the students will have to be compensated by the concerned Student/Parent.
11. Children are not allowed to bring any costly articles especially gold ornaments to school. In case of loss of any such articles, the school authorities will not be responsible in any manner.
12. Mobile Phone, electronic gadgets like camera, cell phone, ipods, electronic audio and other harmful/objectable items like drugs alcohol, crackers are strictly prohibited in school campus. Mobile phone would be confiscated if found in the school campus. Non compliance of these instructions can result even in expulsion from the school.
13. **Parents/guardians will appreciate the fact that leave is not granted in the best interest of the students. In case leave is unavoidable, they must meet the Vice Principals/ Incharge of the respective way and get it sanctioned.**

14. Parents/guardians are requested to cooperate with the school in its attempt to help in the progress of their wards by paying attention to regularity, punctuality, discipline or by taking interest in the assignments given.
15. Parents/Guardians should check the Almanac everyday and make note of the instructions given therein. In case of children studying till standard V, the parents/guardians are advised to check the bag of their wards to see if any notice/ invitation /assignment has been given.
16. Parents/Guardians can meet the Principal and submit a separate letter addressed to him/her in case of legitimate complaint. The Principal will look into the matter personally.
17. Parents/Guardians are advised to give proper details regarding phone no. so that the school can send SMS alert/ Whatsapp message on time. Any change must inform on time for immediate update.
18. Parents /Guardians should bring Escort Cards while coming to the school.
19. Ragging in any form in the school campus is strictly forbidden.
20. Stealing books/money/personal belongings of peer students would lead to strict action from the school authorities.
21. Damaging school property/bursting crackers/using abusive languages/sexual abuse/bullying/playing with colours/fighting with peers/disobeying school rules would lead to serious consequences against the pupil.
22. Demerit cards would be issued by the school authority in case of non-compliance of school rules. Issue of third demerit card to the same pupil would lead to suspension from the school.
23. Students must come to school in school uniform only. The rule applies even when they come to school for any purpose other than attending classes or even after school hours.
24. Violation of school rules, disobeying teachers, disregarding instructions; of House masters would lead to strict action from the school.
25. Students must strictly adhere to the discipline of the online classrooms. They should put on the video and audio mode only when asked by the teachers and join the class with all required stationeries. Uniform should be worn during online classes.
26. No student is allowed to pay online fees during school hours.
27. Parents/Guardians are informed that it would take 7 working days for issue of any certificate from the date of application.

B) Cultural Activities :

Scholarships and Awards :

1. Students scoring 85% and above in aggregate in Class XI are given scholarship in the form of tuition fee waiver either in partial or full.

2. All meritorious students are awarded trophies and certificates for excellence in academics and co-scholastic areas.
3. Certificates and medals are given to students for their punctuality and 100% attendance.
4. NTSE, KVPY, Olympiad (SOF) and IAPT Rank Holders (AIR) will be given 100% scholarship equivalent to 100% admission fees.

HOUSE SYSTEM

There are four houses in the school. Pawan, Pani, Dhart and Akash. Every student becomes a part of one of the houses on admission to the school.

Each house is taken care by one student designated as the House Captain. He/She is assisted in his/her duties by a Cultural and a Sports captain of the House. Two members from the staff are designated as House Incharge and Asst. House Incharge along with a group of teachers to take care of their respective Houses.

Points are awarded to the students throughout the year on the basis of their performance in Cultural, Sports, Literary & other Co-curricular activities.

Inter House activities are organised on Fridays of every month and the Best House is awarded a trophy at the end of the session. The participating students are awarded Certificates / Prizes for their efforts in these activities.

RULES OF WITHDRAWAL

1. A clear one month's notice must be given before a student applies for withdrawal from the school alongwith a written application and duly filled withdrawal form for parents.
2. Transfer certificate will be issued on payment of Rs. 250 (within one week) from the date of deposit of fee settlement/ clearance of all school dues.
3. Caution money will not be adjusted against any other dues and will be released only after the Transfer Certificate is issued.
4. Caution money will be forfeited if not claimed within three months of leaving school.

5. In case an existing student stops attending school without intimating the school authorities, all dues of the school have to be paid till the end of the academic year.
6. Transfer certificate will not be issued during Summer Vacation.
7. A student failing for more than 2 years in the same class will not be permitted to continue in the School.

RULES OF ABSENCE

1. No student would be permitted to leave the school campus during school hours. However, in case of emergency, one authorized guardian should come to the school with application stating the reason for taking his/her ward. However, the decision would be entirely on the discretion of the Principal/ Vice Principals / Incharge to be satisfied & let go after filling the requisite proforma.
2. No student who was absent on the previous day will be admitted to the class without the permission of the Class teacher.
3. Reported absence for more than three consecutive days without granting of leave would have to be granted by the Vice Principals /Incharge of the concerned wing.
4. Attendance would not be permitted to students who leave the campus after appearing in the periodic test. However his/her periodic test would be assessed.
5. Reported absence without granting of leave or unexplained absence for seven consecutive days may result in student's name being struck off from rolls. Re-admission may be granted at the discretion of the Principal/Vice Principals/Incharge only after taking Re-admission.
6. It is mandatory for every student to have at least 85% attendance to appear in Mid-term test /Half-yearly /Pre-Board /Annual Examination. Those who fail to fulfill this criterion may be barred from the respective examination. The relaxation in attendance will be granted on two grounds as suggested by CBSE.
 - a. Medical Ground
 - b. Mishappening in the family.
7. The relaxation in the attendance may be granted subject to the full satisfaction of the Principal.
8. A student suffering from an infectious/contagious disease should produce a Medical Fitness Certificate. Discharge slip would be mandatory in case of hospitalisation of the student.
9. No re-examination would be held for the students who remain absent in any of the examinations.

LIBRARY RULES

1. The School library is open for both teachers and students from 8.00 am to 4.00 pm. At least one library period is assigned to each class during one week.
2. Silence is to be observed in the library.
3. Students who keep books longer than the time permitted shall be fined @ Rs. 5.00 per day.
4. Books in the reference section shall not be taken out of the library.
5. Students should not write or tear anything out of the library books and return it in good condition.
6. Attention of the Librarian should be drawn towards the damaged books which are to be borrowed.
7. Students are entitled to issue one book at a time and keep the same for seven days.
8. Issue of books may be suspended any time by the order of the Principal.
9. All books taken from the library must be returned two weeks before the Final examination.
10. T.C. will not be issued unless a clearance certificate is obtained from the Librarian.

Rules to be observed in the Laboratories


1. Students should maintain silence and working atmosphere in the Laboratory.
2. Seat, instruments & practical records are to be well arranged & kept tidy by the students.
3. No equipment or chemicals, except the one issued for the practical should be handled by the students.
4. Glassware, apparatus & other equipments should be handled with extreme care. **Fine will be imposed on all breakage or damage caused to the equipments.**
5. Students will bring to the notice of the teacher /instructor damaged equipments immediately.
6. Use of White Lab coat is mandatory in all the Science Laboratories.
7. Laboratory is to be left clean & well arranged by the students after the completion of experiments.
8. Students should not carry their own separate apparatus.

SCHOOL BUS SAFETY MEASURES AND RULES

All Bus commuters and stakeholders are requested to abide by the following safety rules mandatorily:

1. The students will be under the authority of the escort teacher(s), drivers and conductors while commuting in their school bus. Hence, they must follow the instructions issued to them regarding the seating arrangements / boarding / alighting from each bus / maintaining all the disciplinary aspects of commuting in the school bus. The bus drivers must not be disturbed by the students, at the time of driving, to avoid any untoward incident and ensure the safety of the commuters.
2. The following are PROHIBITED in the Buses: Carrying Bulky items leading to the inconvenience to other fellow bus commuters, Pushing/Pulling/Dragging others in the bus, Destroying/ Damaging fixtures of the bus, Shouting unnecessarily/Using Unparliamentary words, Spilling food &Water/ Throwing Wrappers of packed food items, playing in or running across at a bus stop etc. are prohibited. These acts may cause harm to others leading to the withdrawal of Bus facility of the concerned culprit.
3. PUNCTUALITY AND SAFETY: Students should always reach 5 Minutes prior to the scheduled arrival of your designated bus at the designated bus stop ONLY and stand in a queue to board the bus. Never run after bus once it leaves. Do not run towards an approaching bus. Wait for the bus to stop and let the conductor open the door. Never go under/ behind the bus, if anything gets dropped out of the bus.
4. WALKING TO / FROM THE BUS STOP: After alighting at the designated bus stop, students should go home directly from the bus stop taking the safest route with the fewest streets to cross. If possible cross the desired streets and corners, using crosswalks if available. Look in all directions before crossing and then safely walk across the street. Always obey traffic signals. Never accept any offer of ride from a stranger. Avoid fighting and rough play while at the bus stop, in the bus, or while getting on or off the bus. Make sure that the bus stops before you get on. Getting on a moving bus is dangerous. Take your seat as soon as you board the bus. Whenever any quarrel takes place in the Bus & Bus stop, it must be informed to the office of the school in writing.

5. **DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS:** Students who violate any of the rules and regulations will receive a negative Bus Conduct Report and will be subjected to a normal progression of penalties. Vandalism in school buses may result in suspension or revocation of the student's riding privilege; parents may be held financially liable for the cost of repairing the damage caused to school buses.
6. **PARK YOUR VEHICLE AT PROPER DISTANCE:** While sitting in your vehicle, ensure that the vehicle is parked away from the bus loading & unloading zone.
7. **PARENTS/ GUARDIANS/ ESCORTS** must not get into the bus for making their wards seated. For the purpose of collecting your ward, ensure that **ONLY** the authorized parent/escort is available 5 Minutes prior to the arrival of Bus at the respective bus stop. Do not indulge in arguments/ ill treat any of the Bus Staff Members nor ask for any favors against the laid Rules & Regulations. In case of any grievance talk to the concerned authority or report personally, in the School Office. Please do not obstruct the movement of the school bus by chasing it or asking demanding it to stop at any non-designated stoppage.
8. **STAY OUT OF THE DANGER ZONE:** The area around a school bus is called the Danger Zone. The students are supposed to stay out of this zone.



9. Mask- Use mask throughout the journey. Travelling without face mask will not be allowed inside the bus while boarding and during the journey.
10. Sanitizer- Carry hand sanitizer and use during journey.
11. Avoid touching your face and use disposable gloves.
12. Avoid travel if you are not well.
13. Maintain social distance during getting in and journey.

14. School buses are available for the students as per availability of the seats.
15. The school does not entertain any request for change of bus stops. School reserves the right to increase the bus fare at any time to meet the increasing cost.
16. **A notice of clear 30 days from the first day of the month is required for withdrawal of the bus facility in the office else one month bus fee will be recovered.**
17. The bus pass should be carried by the students always when using the bus facility.
18. Anyone found travelling by school bus without valid bus pass will be asked to pay the bus fee of entire month.
19. If a child needs to avail bus stop other than the scheduled one, prior permission of Incharge/Vice Principals/Principal is required.
20. The front door of the bus is only permissible for entrance and exit.
21. Bus pass will not be cancelled for the students of Std XII after the month of July, for current academic year.
22. The transport Incharge is to be consulted for details of bus routes.

Discipline Rules

Rules and Regulation:

Entry at the Main Gate :

1. If any student is five minutes late, Discipline committee will allow him/her by giving him/her warning. Late coming will be recorded in the pupil's Almanac to be signed by the parents/ guardians. Class Teacher will verify the same. The student will not get the attendance of that day. Three times late arrival to the school will be resulting in his/her sending back home after calling the parents.

Assembly Area:

1. This is the duty of the class teacher to check the student's uniform every day.
2. If the student is not in his/her proper uniform the class teacher will mention the complaint in his/her school Almanac. But after three times, the committee will take action and will decide to send him/her back along with their parents.
3. The disciplinary committee will also take action against those who have long hair and beard.
4. The dispersal of the students will take place class wise in the guidance of the class teacher.
5. During assembly, the House masters and House teachers should not allow the students to go directly to the washrooms from the Assembly Ground.
6. Students will not be allowed to leave their classrooms without outgoing pass.
7. **House masters and house teachers during recess are responsible for maintaining discipline floor wise.**
8. **House prefects(students) are also responsible for maintaining discipline during morning assembly, recess and dispersal.**
9. House masters are responsible for the distribution of the duties among the house teachers.
10. During the dispersal time House masters, House teachers and PETs will manage the dispersal after that they will do their assigned duty.
11. House teachers and house prefects will do the floor wise duty during Arrival/Recess and Dispersal.
12. On the basis of the performance/behaviour of the students the committee will issue the merit and the demerit card. On the issuance of 3rd demerit card, the student will be suspended from the school.
13. Strict action would be taken against students who are not obedient, create disturbance or pose hurdle in the teaching learning process in the online classes.
14. Students must come to school in school uniform only. This rule applies even when they come to school for any purpose other than attending classes or even after school hours.

DISCIPLINARY ACTION

The sole objective of discipline is to nurture good habits and to show the right path towards progress. Since discipline is the training of mind, parents are also expected to share the joint responsibility by giving regular feedback and observation about their ward's behaviour. Being disciplined is one of the pre requisites for all the students and indiscipline is not tolerated at any cost. However, any disciplinary action is always aimed at improvement of the child.

If a student is found involved in any in-disciplinary act, discipline committee will look into the matter and submit a written report to Principal/In charge with recommendation. Based on the severity of the action, the following remedial action(s) may be initiated against the student:

RULES TO BE OBSERVED FOR THE PAYMENT OF SCHOOL FEES

1. Monthly Fees are to be **paid on working days** from the 1st day of the month to the 25th day between 08.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. In case 25th day of the month is a holiday, 26th day of month shall be considered as the last day for fee payment of the respective month.
2. No fees will be accepted on other days.
3. Late payment of fee beyond 2 months could be reason to send defaulter home and even STRIKE OFF THE NAME FROM THE ROLLS.
4. Results/Promotions will be held up till all dues are cleared by September/March respectively.
5. The names of students who fail to pay fees for two consecutive months will be struck off from the school Roll and Re-admission (50% of admission fee) will be collected.
6. Late fee of Rs. 100 will be charged if the fee of the month is not paid within 25th day of the month.
7. Annual fee must be deposited on or before summer vacation.
8. Payment can be made on-line by card/cheque (on local banks only) payable to "Guru Gobind Singh Public School, Bokaro/Chas/Dhanbad". In case the cheque is dishonored, a penalty of Rupees 300 shall be imposed.
9. Do not entrust cash with very young children.
10. Student should not be given mobile for online fee payment during school hour.
11. Fees for "February and March" and "May and June" are required to be paid by 15th February and 25th May respectively.
12. School reserves the right to increase fees, if necessary, at any time to meet the increasing cost.
13. All fees of first semester and second semester should be cleared before 25th September and 15th February respectively
14. All requests for caution money must be availed within two years from the date of application or else the money would be forfeited to the school account.


