(Ans) Some characteristics of non living things are as follows-

- *Non-living things do not move on their own. For example, a table cannot move from one place to another place on its own.*
- *Non-living things do not need food and water. For example, a chair does not need food and it never grows.*
- *Non-living things do not breathe. For example, a chair does not breathe.*
- *Non-living things do not reproduce. For example, a car cannot produce another car.*
- *Non-living things do not grow. For example, a small table does not grow into a big*

- *Non-living things do not feel. For example, a doll will not cry if you throw it on the ground.*
